

ReDo Day is a one-day program centered on creative learning experiences that constructs a safe, fun, and transparent environment. Focus topics include Attitude, Respect, Anger Management, Stereotypes and Authenticity. The presentation style utilizes talks, large group games, activities and small group discussion to bring down stereotypical barriers. The program assists students in shaping new mental constructs and teaches them how to embrace diversity.

- 5 schools






Take Action Project Objectives...
